Capacity Building Training Opportunities in Cd. Juarez

On May 24, 2018 the Juarez Committee for Children and Youth held the first capacity building training for organizations that work with children and youth. The committee was formed with input from stakeholders, community members and youth service providers with the objective of improving the

quality of programs and services offered to children and youth of Cd. Juarez.

This first training was centered on the law of working with children and youth in Mexico delivered by Erika Espinoza and Jose Luis Flores State Coordinator of SIPINNA (Sistema Estatal de Proteccion Integral de Niñas, Niños y Adolsecentes/Children and Youth Protection State System) of Chihuahua.

The training had the participation of 69 people from 24 organization that included direct program/service providers and different departments of Mexican government.

Children affected by learning loss often also face a nutrition gap during the summer months. Children who rely on school for breakfast, lunch and afterschool meals lose access to those nutritious meals during the summer and their families often struggle to fill the gap.

Summer programs can provide the platform for summer meals, which ensure that children have the nutrition they need to focus and learn throughout the

day. Studies show that when children don't get proper nutrition, they fall behind their peers academically when returning to school in the fall.



<u>El Paso Public Library</u> is currently hosting Children and Teen Summer Reading Clubs. The program officially kicked off on Saturday, June 11th, but they will be hosting weekly themed activities and events throughout the month of July as well.

Libraries Rock! Summer Reading Program is filled with special events, give-aways, parties and much more. Children and youth only have to pledge to read 8 books or 8 hours and turn in their reading logs by the due date to be able to claim a prize.

Rodando Libros- Book Exchange Program at La Rodadora

<u>La Rodadora Espacio Interactivo</u> started a program of book exchange

through the program Rodando Libros.

Rodando libros, pretends to promote community book exchange which will reinforce the healthy habit of reading. La Rodadora will be hosting monthly events at their premises where participants can register a book allowing other people to borrow books that they have not read yet, without the expense of purchasing the book.

How it works: A person registers and leaves at Rodateca (library inside Rodadora) 1 to 5 books that s/he thinks other people should read. Then children and youth wait until the official times of "Rodando Libros" are released to pick up different books they expressed interest on reading, but limited to the amount they brought to share. Books are returned a week before the next Rodando Libros schedule, and the cycle repeats.
